- 1** Republic in southwestern Africa on the Atlantic Ocean; achieved independence from Portugal in 1975 and was the scene of civil war until 1990 (6)
- 2** (Old Testament) the first king of the Israelites who defended Israel against many enemies (especially the Philistines) (4)
- 3** Volcanic island republic in Melanesia; independent since 1980 (7)
- 4** King of Scotland from 1306 to 1329; defeated the English army under Edward II at Bannockburn and gained recognition of Scottish independence (1274-1329) (5)
- 5** Body of water in the foothills of the Alps in Northern Italy (4,4)
- 6** Italian statesman, first Premier of a unified Italy (6)
- 12** (Greek mythology) famous mythical Greek hero (8)
- 14** French philosopher who was a leading figure of the Enlightenment in France; principal editor of an encyclopaedia that disseminated the scientific and philosophical knowledge of the time (1713-1784) (7)
