



**Across**

- 1 Street - located near the Kelvingrove Gallery, also the scale colour named when converting colour images to black & white (4)
- 3 Street - Site of the Avon Steelworks, made up of two words, the first is the Scottish for valley, the other, an open air public place (8)
- 9 Street - Finnieston area - also the surname of the Canadian actor who played Bill Nolan in Knots Landing. (7)
- 10 Street - Bridgeton area- also a French name for a 'V' shaped fortification (5)
- 11 Brae & Road - also a house inhabited or formally inhabited by a minister (5)
- 12 Avenue - Hillington area - also an area of the Scottish Highlands including the northern part Perth & Kinross. Matad was an earl of this area (6)
- 14 Road - also a town on the Firth of Forth and a dockyard (6)

- 16 Arcade - THE place to go for jewellery in Glasgow. Also an area of the Western Isles (6)
- 19 Auldhouse Road - Old English word meaning lower or under Auldhouse Road. (6)
- 21 Street - East End, between the Gallowgate & London Road. Also a colour (5)
- 24 Gardens - Gorbals area - also the first name of the 40s Hollywood actor who starred as Robin Hood (5)
- 25 Avenue, Circus & Drive - also the name for accumulated glacial debris (7)
- 26 Court - Milton area - also a Scottish island near Harris in the Outer Hebrides (8)
- 27 Street - East End, also the surname of Wallace, a silent movie star immortalised on the Hollywood Walk Of Fame, and he was once described as 'The screen's most perfect lover' (4)

**Down**

- 1 Avenue - Toryglen district. The word means 'great valley' and it is also the name of a beach in

- 2 Street - Dalmarnock district. The tower block was demolished by a controlled explosion in 2005. Also the first name of Robin Hood's minstrel (5)
- 4 Drive - Newlands district - also the surname of Robert, the author of Christian books such as *The Work Of Christ* and *Through Western Eyes* (6)
- 5 Street & Court - also a point on the compass (5)
- 6 Place - Scotstoun district - Alexander 'Greek' Thomson designed a villa here, which is in Kilcreggan, Helensburgh (7)
- 7 Street - one in the City and one in the Calton district. Both originally called New Street. Also the title of a royal ruler (4)
- 8 Street & Drive - Broomloan district. First name of the Scottish hero, The Bruce (6)
- 13 Street - Possilpark district - The first part of the word means 'valley' in Scotland, and the second is a part of the body. (8)
- 15 Street - surname of the

- actress who won an oscar in 1930 for the film *The Divorcee* (7)
- 17 Street - Bridgeton district - also the location of a small settlement found on the only railway station between Laig and Golspie in the Scottish Highlands. (6)
- 18 Street - Anderston district - not named after the war that started in 1854, but to the nickname given to Simpson, a local man, who was commissioned as a war artist (6)
- 20 Street - Govan district - also the first name of the actress who won an oscar for best supporting actress in 1971 for *Airport* (5)
- 22 Street - Shettleston district. Heading north across Rannoch Moor towards Glencoe there is a road that literally leads to nowhere. This glen and loch has a derelict pier. (5)
- 23 Street & Road - named after the Duke who was the father of a long-reigning Queen (4)
