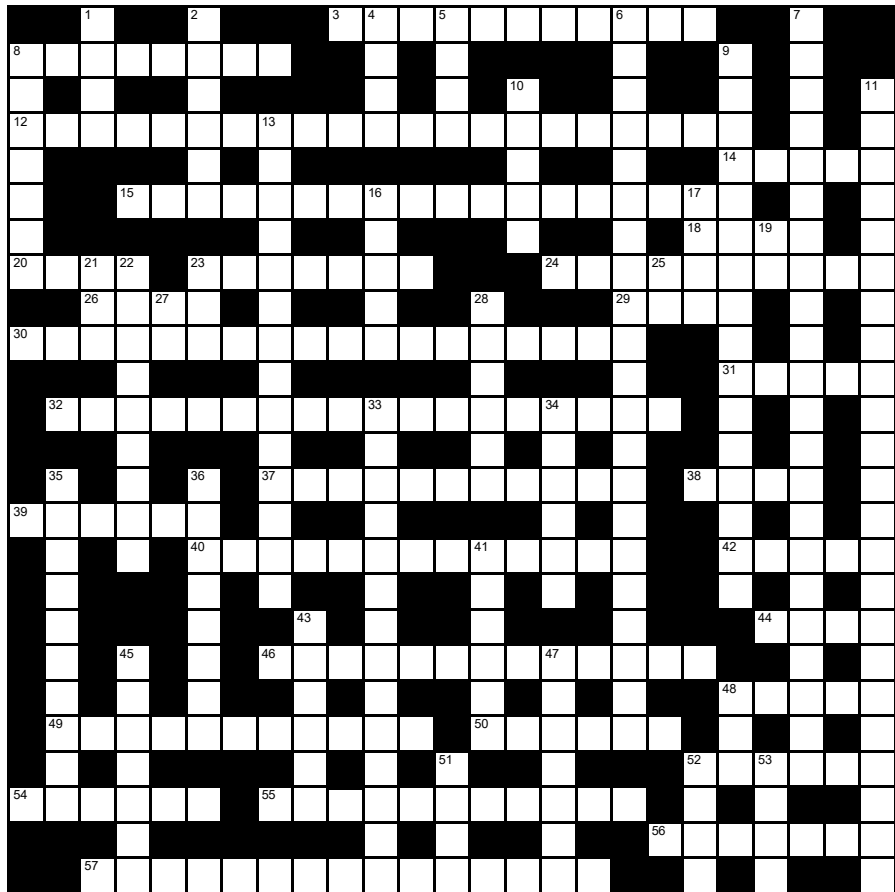

- 40 Japanese 1957 historical drama directed by Akira Kurosawa, which transposed the setting of *Macbeth* from Scotland to Japan (6,2,5)

- 9 Swedish drama directed by Ingmar Bergman in 1957. It is often considered to be one of Bergman's greatest and most moving films and one of the greatest films ever made (4,12)
